

WATER QUALITY ADVISORY NOTICE

October 2, 2025

The District of Lake Country, in consultation with Interior Health, has issued a **WATER QUALITY ADVISORY (WQA)** starting **October 2nd, 2025** for your property. The advisory is being issued in abundance of caution due to the potential for low pressure and potential water outage during planned work on the water system. A map highlighting the affected customers is attached.

The WQA is anticipated to last 3-5 days and will be removed once testing confirms the water is safe to drink. Letters will be hand delivered when the water quality notice is rescinded. Additional information and live updates will also be posted on the District website, www.lakecountry.bc.ca.

The District of Lake Country and Interior Health recommend that children, the elderly, people with weakened immune systems and anyone seeking additional protection in the affected area (see map on next page) drink boiled water or a safe alternative. Water intended for drinking, washing fruits and vegetables, making beverages or ice, or brushing teeth should be boiled for one minute. Boiled water should then be refrigerated in a clean, covered container. Customers could also choose to use bottled water or water that has been filtered through a well-maintained treatment device. A water fill station is available at the Winfield Arena, see image to the right.

The District also encourages residents to reduce non-essential water use to help prevent pressure loss.
